An Introduction to Trail Cameras– Exploring the Secret Lives of NC Wildlife

Location : Stone Mountain State Park , 3042 Frank Parkway, Roaring Gap, NC 28668.

Date and Time: Tuesday, April 10th, from 10am to 3pm

Join NC Wildlife Resources Commission staff member Kevin Hining for a 5 hour Criteria II or III workshop intended to introduce participants to trail cameras and their many uses for exploring and monitoring wildlife populations. Participants will learn how to program and deploy a variety of popular trail cameras, as well as how to download and interpret trail camera photos. The workshop will also explore citizen science opportunities such as the Candid Critters program, and discuss the use of trail cameras in research conducted by NC Wildlife Resources Commission staff. Participants are eligible for 5 hours of Criteria II or III credit towards the NC OEE Environmental Education Certification, and school teachers receive 0.5 CEU credits.

Participants will spend time outside going over how to install cameras and retrieve photos. As a result, please bring appropriate clothing and footwear. Also, to ensure we finish on time, please bring lunch or any snacks you might need.
