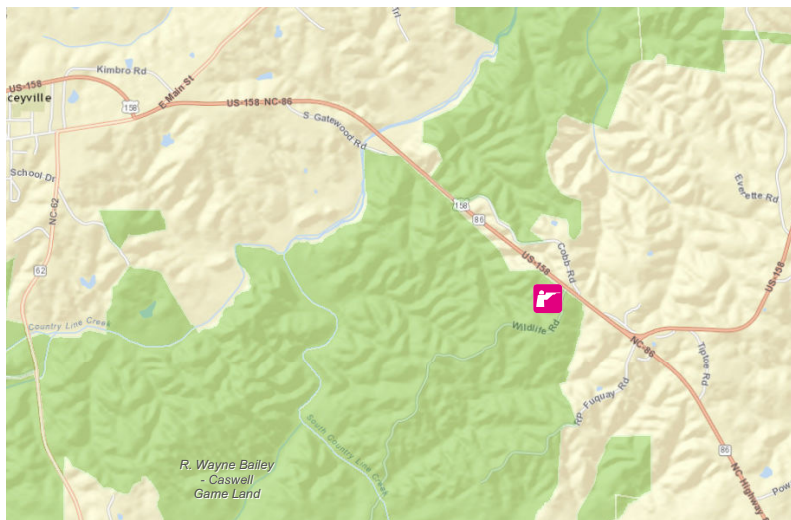




Caswell Shooting Range

Shooting Range Program

Shooting sports are gaining in popularity, particularly recreational shooting. To accommodate this growth, the N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission's Shooting Range Program provides and maintains public shooting ranges across the state that offer a safe, controlled and organized environment for sportsmen and recreational shooters alike. Most of the agency's shooting ranges comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act and are free or charge a nominal fee. Through various partnerships, the Wildlife Commission funds the construction, maintenance and operation of shooting ranges using hunting license receipts and Pittman-Robertson funds, which are 10 percent excise taxes collected from manufacturers of guns and ammunition. Regulations for Use

No person shall use designated shooting ranges for any purpose other than for firearm or archery marksmanship, development of shooting skills or for other safe uses of firearms and archery equipment. All other uses, including camping, building fires, operating concessions or other activities not directly involved with recreational or competitive shooting are prohibited.

When using shooting ranges, the following is prohibited:

- Littering, except that clay targets broken on the range by the shooter may be left on the grounds where they fall
- Shooting at anything made of glass
- Leaving a vehicle or other obstruction in such a manner that it will prevent, impede or inconvenience the use of the range by other persons
- Parking anywhere except at an authorized parking zone posted as such
- Handling any firearms or archery equipment in a careless or reckless manner
- Intentionally shooting into any target holder, post, or other permanent fixture or structure
- Shooting a firearm in a manner that would cause any rifled or smoothbore projectiles to travel off of the range, except that shotgun shot, size No. 4 or smaller may be allowed to travel from the range if it presents no risk of harm or injury to any person
- Alcohol
- Handling firearms while under the influence of an impairing substance
