Fisheries Committee Chairman Wes Seegars called the meeting to order at 11:45 am.

Mountain Heritage Trout Waters

 Bob Curry presented information on the Town of Lansing's request to recognize the Delayed Harvest Trout Waters section of the Big Horse Creek as Mountain Heritage Trout Waters. Lansing has been instrumental in obtaining and maintaining unrestricted public access to this reach of Big Horse Creek. Staff recommended including the reach in the Mountain Heritage Trout Waters program, and the Committee unanimously approved the recommendation.

<u>Action:</u> The Fisheries Committee recommends that the Commission designate the Town of Lansing as a Mountain Heritage Trout City and recognize the Delayed Harvest Trout Waters section of Big Horse Creek as Mountain Heritage Trout Waters.

Fisheries Management Updates

- Pisgah Bird Predation Update Bob reported the trout were stocked during May through July per the response plan and the fish were 9-10 inches in length. The target number and size of trout will be available for the stockings beginning in October.
- Lake Mattamuskeet Update The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service hosted an open house on June 26 to announce improvements to fisheries and fish access at the lake. Commission Fisheries and Wildlife Management staff attended. At the meeting, USFWS staff indicated that they had completed careful review of the Commission's recommendation to "hold lake levels higher" and the plan (USFWS decision) was to continue to allow the lake level to ebb and flow under the current passive management strategy with no active management. Bob reported that Commission biologists continue to evaluate the lake's fishery including the stocking of largemouth bass fingerlings as part of ongoing research, tagging adult largemouth bass collected from the lake, and conducting an angler creel survey. The Commission has recently agreed to provide partial funding from October 2014 September 2015 for the lake's two USGS gauging stations (\$5,000 per station). Erik Christofferson reported that renovations to the boating access area near the lodge are finished and work on the Rose Bay Canal access area will be completed in the very near future. Mark Hamlett is currently working with NCDOT to conduct a bathymetric survey of the lake and he is coordinating with biological staff to define the scope of work.

<u>Action:</u> Staff was asked to look at the extent of saltwater plume within the lake and its impact on aquatic vegetation.

No additional topics were discussed.

Chairman Seegars adjourned the meeting at 12:05.
