


Sunday Hunting on Game Lands – *Why Now?*



Outdoor Heritage Act (2015) – Removed the absolute prohibition on hunting with firearms on Sunday in North Carolina that had been in place since 1868, opening up Sunday hunting on private lands with restrictions.

Outdoor Heritage Enhanced Act (2017) – Granted authority to public land managers, including the N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission, to implement new options for hunting on Sundays on game lands, subject to the following limitations:

- No hunting with a firearm between 9:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m.
- No hunting deer with the use of dogs
- No hunting within 500 yards of a place of worship




The N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission was created by the General Assembly in 1947 to conserve and sustain the state's fish and wildlife resources through research, scientific management, wise use, and public input.

AGENCY GOALS:


- Ensure citizens have the opportunity for safe and readily available participation in hunting, fishing, boating and other wildlife-related activities.

- Serves as a leader in sustaining working lands, conserving wildlife habitats and species diversity, and maintaining the hunting and fishing heritage of N.C.
